Caritas Leeds—Formal Launch September 23rd 2017



What is Caritas Leeds? The word 'Caritas' (Charity) encapsulates Christian love for all people; a love which is expressed through the practical service of those in need. Pope Benedict XVI wrote in his first encyclical Letter: <u>Deus Caritas Est</u> 'The Church's deepest nature is expressed in her threefold responsibility:

- 1) proclaiming the word of God,
- (2) celebrating the sacraments
- (3) exercising the ministry of charity.

These duties presuppose each other and are inseparable. For the Church, charity is not a kind of welfare activity which could equally well be left to others, but is a part of her nature, an indispensable expression of her very being.' Pope Francis, building on his predecessor's teaching has likened the Church to a 'Field Hospital' - "I see clearly that what the Church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful...I see the Church as a field hospital after battle. It is useless to ask a seriously injured person if he has high cholesterol...you have to heal his wounds; then we can talk about everything else. Heal the wounds...heal the wounds. And you have to start from the ground up." (More about Caritas Leeds next week)
