There was a lively discussion with the pros and cons of amalgamation put forth. The two Deaneries will meet again in November and December after which a formal recommendation will be made to Bishop Marcus.



One outcome was the dates for Confirmation for both Deaneries. The Date for the Huddersfield Deanery is **Tuesday 18th February 2020** at a time and place to be determined. It will probably take place at 7.00pm and will be in either St Patrick's or English Martyrs in Huddersfield. Bishop Marcus will be the celebrant.

The Canonisation of Blessed John Henry Newman



This Sunday, October 13th, Pope Francis will officially declare Blessed John Henry Newman a Saint of the Catholic Church. He will be the first person from England to be canonised since the 40 Martyrs of England and Wales in 1970. John Henry Newman lived through most of the 19th century, 1801-1900. For half his life he was an Anglican and then in 1845 he was received into the Catholic Church. He was an outstanding theologian, preacher and poet. He was made a cardinal shortly before his death.
