Below are a couple of reflections on this prayer, one from Mary's Meals and a repeat of last weekend's reflection by Fr Ernesto Cardenal, a priest and poet from Nicaragua, and one from Mary's Meals, a charity which feeds the poorest children in the world.



"We pray to God for his name to be holy, and it is up to us to make his name holy. We pray for his kingdom to come, and it is up to us to build it. We pray that his will be done on earth, and it is up to us to do his will. We pray to him for bread, and it

is up to us to make it and share it. We pray to him for forgiveness, and it is up to us to forgive. We pray not to fall into evil and it is up to us to escape from it. That's what is interesting about this prayer. I think a lot of people don't say the Lord's prayer, but in their hearts they are asking for all this."



"Our Father, give us this day our daily bread and forgive us for the times when we take more than our share of the bread that belongs to all. Let us help You fill the starving with good things, not with the scrapes from our table. Teach us how to share what is not ours to keep. Clothe us with your love that we may complete each good work You created us to do. Place in our hearts your compassion for each starving child and use our little acts of love so that they starve no more. Amen."
