this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells us that the greatest commandment is to love God first of all with all our heart, indeed with the whole of us. This will help us to love other people. Jesus reminds us that our love for God is also made known in the way that we love others. Whenever we love and care for one another we can be sure that God is with us. Can we choose a special way in which we can show our love for God and for each other this coming week? Perhaps we can actually tell members of our family that we love them, and show this through an unexpected act of kindness. We might try to be more patient, tolerant and understanding, and if someone has upset us or hurt us, we can forgive them and begin again. There are so many ways we can choose to love God and others.

#### A Message from Nicaragua



One of the great blessing for our parish over the past couple of years has been the wonderful relationship we have with so many people in some villages on the outskirts of Managua the capital of

Nicaragua. This began with Fr Ernesto and continued after his death, may he rest in peace, with Fr Luis. When we began live streaming Mass on a Sunday Morning Fr Luis was able to get

connectivity and people gathered from the different parishes that make up the parish to celebrate with us. Over time people in their own villages managed to make connection, as did Sr Anna Maria, in the barrio in which she lives and works.

After last Sunday's Mass Fr Luis sent an email part of which read as follows: Now - apparently all the parishes had connectivity. Don't ask me how they do it. Have no idea but great creativity and teamwork. Hope you are sitting down but between all the villages there were about 4,000 in all. I had 200 here. Ana Maria told me she had 217 total In two different parts of the barrio. So we are connected. And we saw a cloth from Nicaragua. It was the one small one near the lectern on the floor. That is from NICARAGUA. We all got excited!!!!!

It is wonderful that we have this connection and sobering to think that with our numbers before lockdown it would take us SIX MONTHS to have 4,000 at Mass!



#### **Council of Priests-Celebrating Christmas!**

On Thursday there was an on line Council of Priests meeting with Bishop Marcus. One of the points for discussion was the celebration of Christmas this year. It is highly unlikely that the churches throughout the diocese will be able to open without the current or very similar restrictions, limiting numbers very significantly. Given the smallness of our church we would have to celebrate 12+ Masses on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day

to accommodate all those who have been coming over the past few years! This is neither possible or sensible. One suggestion was to make use of the OCTAVE of Christmas, i.e. Christmas Day and the week following. Christmas is a time when

people who do not normally come to Mass, make the decision to come, so publicising widely what will be on offer will also be needed. Christmas may seem an age away but it is a shade over two months. If anyone has suggestions please let Fr Bernard know.
