First Sunday of Advent 28th November



This weekend is the beginning of the Church's New Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent. The four Sundays of Advent follow the same cycle of Gospel passages. The first Sunday speaks to us of the Second Coming of Christ at the end of time; the middle two Sundays concentrate on the important figure of John the Baptist, and the fourth Sunday prepares us for the birth of Jesus.

This year Luke will be the gospel we will hear during

Ordinary Time. It has been described as showing us the 'Compassionate face of God' with its parables of the Good Samaritan and The Prodigal Son. Luke also puts great emphasis on the demands of being a disciple of Jesus. As we journey through Luke's gospel during the coming year we will find Jesus at prayer before he makes major decisions, for example the naming of the Twelve, we

will also see the importance he places on the role of the Holy Spirit. Luke also wrote The Acts of the Apostles and we are indebted to him for his insights into the lives of those first followers of Jesus who came to be called Christians. We follow in this great tradition and Advent is an opportunity for us to take a good deep look into our lives and ask ourselves how we might, in the words of Pope Francis, 'see the things that really matter'.
