The Body and Blood of Christ



This Solemnity celebrating the Eucharist began in a quiet Belgian Convent in the 13th century. St Juliana had a vision, seeing the moon shining brightly except for one small part which was in shadow. The meaning of the vison was then revealed to her. The moon represented the Liturgical Year, the shadow a missing feast in honour of the Blessed Sacrament. St Juliana mentioned this

vison to her spiritual director who shared it with others. Within a space of a few years Pope Urban IV had established the feast of Corpus Christ—the Body of Christ, in the Church's Liturgical calendar. Centuries later in 1849 Pope Pius IX added the feast of the Precious Blood to be celebrated on July 1st. After the 2nd Vatican Council and the revision of the Liturgy, the two feasts were brought together and became one Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.



This weekend we celebrate the wonderful gift of Jesus, his life, his love and himself under the forms of bread and wine in Holy Communion. The word for this week in The Wednesday Word is **Nourish** and this Solemnity invites us to reflect on how we are nourished, first of all by God's word in the Scriptures, and then invited to

receive Jesus truly present in the consecrated bread and wine. May we as a parish, as families and as individuals grow both in our appreciation of, and gratitude for such a great gift, remembering that

"We eat the Body of Christ to become the Body of Christ."

A short message from Pope Francis on the Sacred Heart:



"The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the highest human expression of divine love. Next Friday, in fact, we will celebrate the Solemnity of the

Sacred Heart of Jesus: the feast that sets the tone for the whole month. Popular piety highly prizes symbols, and the Heart of Jesus is the ultimate symbol of God's

mercy – but it is not an imaginary symbol, it is a real symbol, which represents the centre, the source from which salvation for all humanity gushed forth. In the Gospels we find several references to the Heart of Jesus, for example, in the passage where Christ says, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart. (Mt 11:28-29)" Then there is the key story of the death of Christ according to John. This evangelist in fact testifies to what he saw on Calvary: that a soldier, when Jesus was already dead, pierced his side with a spear, and from the wound flowed blood and water from the heart of Jesus, the Lamb slain on the cross, flow forgiveness and life for all."
