From Sunday's Gospel



Jesus said to the chief priests and the scribes, 'There was once a landowner who planted a vineyard, rented it to some tenant farmers and then went off far away. When the fruit season came, he sent some of his servants to the farmers to collect the produce. But the farmers seized his servants. He then

sent his son, saying to himself "They will respect my son.,. But the farmers said to one another, "Look, here is the heir; come on, let's take over his inheritance." So they seized the son, threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the lord of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those farmers? "He will bring those bad men to a bad end," was the reply, "then he will rent the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the fruit at harvest time." Then Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: it was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and is wonderful to see? I tell you that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to people who will produce its fruit.""

Messenger. Jesus told the story in today's gospel to some religious leaders who were not listening to God's messengers. God continues to send messengers to us today and the question is do we listen to them, being reminded that God has a great plan for each one of us. Pope Francis also reminds us that each one of us can help other people to discover the joy of Jesus' message, more by the way we live than the words we speak. If we l isten to God in prayer at the beginning of the day, it will help us to show God's love and kindness to those around us. We may never know what good an act of kindness can do to another person.

IMPORTANT UPDATE ON COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS IN PLACES OF WORSHIP 28TH

SEPTEMBER 2020

The Government has updated its guidance for Places of Worship. This is to ensure that social interaction is limited in order to reduce the risk of viral transmission. From Monday 28th September, the following numbers will be permitted for: **Wedding Services**: a maximum of 15 people will be able to attend the service and reception. **Funeral Services**: up to a maximum of 30 people can attend a funeral service but the "rule of 6" will apply to wakes and receptions afterwards.

Attending Mass in Catholic Churches: There is no change to attendance at Mass . All should limit social contact as much as possible and minimise all interactions with those they do not live with within the church building and immediately outside of it.
