## From Sunday's Gospel



One day Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people, "What do you think about this? A man had two sons. He went to one and said, 'My son, go and work in my vineyard today.' His son replied, 'I will not go,' but later changed his mind and went. The man said the

same thing to his other son and the son replied, 'Certainly sir, ' but did not go. Which of the two sons did the will of their father?' They replied, 'The first.' Then Jesus said to them, 'I tell you truly that those we consider outcasts are going ahead of you into the kingdom of heaven. Did not John the Baptist come to you, teaching what is right and true, and you did not believe him? Yet the outcasts believed him, and even then you did not change your minds and believe him."'



Pope Francis writes, "My dear young people, we can all improve and change for the better." Today's word is Change. In this Sunday's gospel both sons

changed their minds, but only one of them changed it for the better. Each new day is an opportunity for us to change. We can ask God to help us change and so enrich our lives and the world around us, to love as Jesus loved, and so to change for the better. We might like to ask ourselves if there is anything about ourselves that we would like to change? If there is, for example to listen more than speak, how can we make that change? Do we need someone to help us? St John Henry Newman wrote, 'To live is to change, and to be perfect is to have changed often.' What changes are we going to make this week?
