From Sunday's Gospel

Jesus told a parable to his disciples. "Why do you observe the splinter in your friend's eye and never notice the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your friend, 'Let me take the splinter that is in your eye,' when you cannot see the plank in your own eye. You hypocrite! Take the plank out of your own eye first, and then you will see clearly enough to take the splinter that is in your friend's eye. A good tree cannot produce bad fruit and a bad tree cannot produce good fruit. You can tell what a tree is like by the fruit it produces. The same is true of you, your words show what is in your heart."

Sunday's Gospel Jesus is using parables, short stories, to teach us important lessons. Jesus reminds us that what we are really like is shown by our actions as well as our words. Ash Wednesday is this coming Wednesday, March 6th, when we begin the great season of grace which we call Lent. In his Lenten message for 2019 Pope Francis invites Christians "to embody the paschal mystery more deeply and concretely in their personal, family and social lives, above all by <u>fasting, prayer and</u> almsgiving."

Fasting, the Pope says, means turning away from the temptation to "devour" everything to satisfy our voracity; *Prayer* teaches us to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego; *Almsgiving*, whereby we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves in the illusory belief that we can secure a future that does not belong to us. If we follow this journey, he said it "is possible to rediscover the joy of God's plan for creation and for each of us, which is to love him, our brothers and sisters, and the entire world, and to find in this love our true happiness". **Please see the Lent Diary in the Porch or pick up a copy from the back of the**
