The Opening of Places of Public Worship



Bishop Marcus has asked that the following be printed in the newsletter, unfortunately it came too late for last week. "From Monday, 15th June 2020, Catholic Churches in England are being allowed to open for individual private

prayer. The conditions for this are that social distancing, stewarding and sanitizing arrangements have been put in place and agreed. This does not mean that every church in our Diocese will be able to open immediately, and it may be that some churches will not be able to open for some time. Please, do be patient and understanding; there may be a number of very good reasons why individual churches will not be able to re-open straightaway. Individual parishes will publish the opening times and days of when the church will be open. This will depend very

much on the availability of volunteer stewards and with social distancing arrangements having been put in place. Please continue to check the websites of your local Catholic churches and the Diocesan website for further information." **Fr Richard Carter, our local Dean**, has very kindly offered to visit the parish in the next week or so to share what has taken place at St Patrick's Church in Huddersfield, where last week a member of the Property Office spent four hours taking measurements and giving advice as to what must happen before the church can be opened for Private Prayer.

Our thanks to Fr Elliott Wright for bringing the oils which Bishop Marcus blessed and consecrated at Pentecost for use during the coming year.
