The church was bought from The Ebenezer Congregation in 1966 and the first Mass was celebrated by Bishop Wheeler on May 5th 1967.

Next Weekend the Second Collection is for Day for Life supporting the Pro Life work of The Bishops' Conference. This year we are asked to think and pray about: **Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery**

Jesus tells us, "I have come that you may have life, and have it to the full." (John 10:10 NJB). But many people do not have life to the full. They have fallen victim to the scourge of human trafficking and modern slavery which are an assault on a person's innate human dignity. Trafficking is a growing problem, in the UK alone, it is estimated that every year there are over 13,000 victims of trafficking. The Catholic community can make a real difference to help solve this problem – to help them find freedom and live life to the full. There are many organisations working to put a stop to human trafficking and modern slavery. One of these, the **Santa Marta Group**, works internationally to bring the Catholic Church and law enforcement agencies together to eradicate slavery. To read more visit www.santamartagroup.com.
