From Sunday's Gospel

The angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up quickly, take the child and his mother with you and escape into Egypt and stay there until I tell you, because King Herod intends to search for the child and do away with him." So Joseph got up and, taking Jesus and Mary with him, left that night for Egypt, where he stayed until Herod was dead. Then the angel in a dream told Joseph to take Jesus and Mary back to Israel, but they did not go to Bethlehem because Herod's son, the new ruler, might try to harm Jesus. So instead they were to Nazareth in Galilee and made their home there."



Pope Francis writes, "My dear your friends, in Joseph we learn how to respond to God's call." Today's word is **Joseph.** In this weekend's gospel passage

we read about St Joseph's openness and obedience to God's word which he received from the angel of the Lord through dreams. This reminds us that God's word can come to us in different ways, and that St Joseph, like Mary, the mother of Jesus, is a model for parents and children alike. Will we ask St Joseph to be close to our families this week?
