## The Baptism of the Lord

This weekend we celebrate The Baptism of the Lord, a feast which brings to a close the **Season of Christmas**. It will take all our imagination to move from the crib, which is still in front of the altar, to the river Jordan in which Jesus was baptised. Jesus had no need to be baptised, but he did so in order to identify with us, and to 'hallow' the waters of baptism.



Tomorrow we begin what is called Ordinary Time in the Liturgical Calendar. Unless there is a feast day, vestments will be green, both during the week and on Sundays until we enter Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 2nd, when people vestments will be used.

There is a **three year Sunday cycle of Readings,** with one of the Synoptic Gospels being the guide throughout Ordinary Time. Year A—Matthew; Year B-Mark; Year C-Luke. This

liturgical year is C so Luke will be our guide. Next Sunday is the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time. If you have access to the CTS New Daily Missal you will find the readings on page 783 and following.

The **weekday readings follow a two year cycle**. When the year is an odd number, the readings are from Year 1, and when the year is an even number, as this year of 2022, the readings are from Year 2. If you have access to the CTS New Daily Missal you will find the readings on page 2070 and following.

#### Pastoral Statistics Return 2021

Each year the parish has to send in the Parish Statistics for the year just ended. During 2021 there were:

12 Baptisms; 1 reception into Full Communion; 11 children

received First Holy Communion; 1 Confirmation (of the adult baptised);

1 Marriage and 8 Funerals. The Average attendance at Mass over the last two weekends in September and the first two in October was 54.

Looking at situations from the point of view of the person with dementia Providing opportunities for the person to have conversations and relationships with other people

Ensuring the person has the chance to try new things or take part in activities they enjoy.
